Morgan 110th—Quite a Day!



Over one thousand visitors descended on our tiny village of Stoke Lacy to celebrate the 110 year history of Morgan cars. The village galvanised for the day with almost 100 volunteers working this classic car show and vintage fete.

Morgan owners from across the region learned about the rich Morgan heritage embedded in the beautiful, newly-renovated church of St. Peter & St. Paul. Local artists' exhibited their work which again had a distinctly Morgan flavour.

The vintage fete, opened by Morgan Managing Director Steve Morris, offered a distinctly 1910 feel with everything from a coconut shy to welly wanging, and even a murder mystery.

Music was heard across the churchyard all afternoon with an upbeat set from the Worcester Ukulele band and into the evening with the boogie-woogie sounds from Almeley's excellent Springfield Band.

The event was possible due to the generous Heritage Lottery Fund grant given to re-roof the golden spire. Maurice Clothier who has individually hand-made thousands of oak shingles for the spire was on hand to give wood-turning demonstrations.

A really happy day celebrating the completion of a mammoth village project and as an added bonus funds raised for the following charitable organisations on 6th July were as follows: Parkinsons's Disease Society: £106.00, Help for Heroes: £217.50, Stoke Lacy Village Hall: £400.00 Stoke Lacy Church Restoration and Heritage Project: £5,500.00. A grand total well in excess of £6,000.00.







Entrance fee per class: 10p except for those classes for children of "15 years or under" identified with an which will be free.

Prizes: Printed Certificates will be awarded for 1st, 2nd and 3rd and highly commended in each class.

Points will be awarded to each exhibitor at the rate of 5 for first prize, 3 for second prize, 2 for third prize and 1 for highly commended. These points will accumulate towards a prize for the overall winner of a voucher for £20 to spend at a local garden centre. £10 will be given to the child of 15 years or under with the most points.



Stoke Lacy Parish Council Report

Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting held on Wednesday 10th July 2019 in Stoke Lacy Village Hall at 7.30pm

Those present were:

Councillor Janet Ivison (Chairman); Councillors Anne Reece John Westwood and Bill Morgan. Apologies were received from Councillor Helen Bufton and Ward Councillor Jonathan Lester and CSO Susan Berrett.

In attendance

CSO Jack Davies; 2 members of the public

There were no declarations of interest. The minutes of the last meeting were approved.

WARD COUNCILLORS' AND POLICE REPORTS

Ward Councillor Jonathan Lester emailed a report giving a vote of thanks to all who helped at the Morgan 110 event on 6th July. He then gave a review of Council business and recommended that everyone regularly looked at Herefordshire Council website for updates.

Councillor Reece arrived at 7.35pm, with apologies

PCSO Jack Davies reported on Stoke Lacy matters, including speeding through Crick's Green. He recommended a 50mph sign be painted on the road and a 'Hidden Dip' sign erected. A speed survey would take place in Stoke Lacy when the speed gun had been re-calibrated. The members of the public reported on a motorbike coming through the village at a very high speed regularly at about 4.30am. PCSO Davies said he would get this monitored.

The Chairman asked PCSO Davies if he would put a notice on a car which had been parked in the village hall over a period of time, without permission.

Otherwise there were no problems in the village, but PCSO Davies encouraged residents to contact him or PCSO Berrett to report issues.

The clerk had written to Mr Andrew Davies, Planning Officer for Stoke Lacy area, asking for a written response as to whose responsibility it was to ensure the provision for storm water drainage on both the Newlands and Orchard development sites and assurance given to the Parish Council that such provision was adequate to cope with 100-year eventualities

The clerk was asked to write and request the Parish Council had a site visit of the drainage system and was provided with a plan of the drains as they go down the fields.

Newlands launch 22nd June: Councillor Ivison reported that 40 people had registered an interest, at least 2 houses were reserved and 2 sold sstc,, with interest from local people, which was what the Parish Council had hoped for.

25th. June 2019 - Garden visit to Ashley Farm

Despite a rainy morning by midday it had stopped and it was pleasing to have a good turn out. We were warmly welcomed by Roger and Jackie Petroni, given maps and invited to explore. The five acre garden was designed to compliment the beautiful 16th century house and its out-buildings. We entered between the buildings into an impressive space with a canal bordered by pleached limes and box cones leading to the main house. On the far side a wide grass slope allows a clear view from the house to the open Herefordshire countryside beyond, with swifts providing a spectacular arial display. Either side of this are a variety of themed spaces contained within wide, tall yew hedges keeping each space self contained with narrow openings allowing passage between. The design is strong and the structure formal but within this there is a wonderful softness and flow. As one moves away from the house the formality is replaced by wilder areas and woodland. This garden was begun in 2004 and it must have taken a lot of work for it to become what it is today. The Petronis have recently planted a native woodland, this is an ever evolving project as all gardens should be. Before leaving we enjoyed a cup of tea with a choice of delicious cakes. We would like to thank our hosts for their hospitality.
